Directions

- 1. Moderator should be chosen who at least has a working microphone. If mic doesn't work right away, select a moderator who has a working mic.
- 2. Moderators can use a webcam as well.
- 3. Please only turn on webcams when students have something specific to say or show related to the topic.
- 4. Each student looks for two beautiful photographs about their favorite species.
- 5. Please select medium sized images to upload to the class forum to share with the group. You may need to use your resize tools from you desktop.
- 6. At the Photography Forum (located near the top of the CurrClick Live resource page) upload your photo. Please put your name, the photographer's name (if given) and a short description of what the photo is.
- 7. After everyone has found and uploaded their two images, the group can vote on the best photos.
- 8. You can do a 1st place, 2nd place and 3rd place.

Suggestions for choosing the best photos

- 1. <u>Technical Excellence</u> Examples: Is the subject in focus or is it blurry in all the wrong places? Including: proper exposure, shutter speed, white balance and depth of field. And be aware of lens flare!
- 2. **Originality** is the photo unique?
- 3. <u>Composition</u> Are the all the elements in the photo arranged in an attractive way?
- 4. **Artistic** Is the photo artistically beautiful/attractive?

- 1. Outside of the live class time, photograph your favorite plant(s), animal(s), Nature Connections or MathArt topic.
- 2. Upload your two best photos to the Photography Room forum located at the top of the CurrClick Live resource page. Label the photo with a creative name and that it's for the Photography Contest.
- 3. During the live class, a moderator should be chosen who at least has a working microphone. If mic doesn't work right away, select a moderator who has a working mic.
- 4. Moderators can use a webcam as well, but it's not necessary.
- 5. Please only turn on webcams when students have something specific to say or show related to the topic.
- 6. Select two of your best photos and upload them to the class "Photography Room" forum.
- 7. During a set date (perhaps the last class), everyone can vote on the photos with 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , and 3^{rd} place.
- 8. Someone can create an certificate award for the winners.
